Electric vehicles made up more than 5% of new vehicle sales in the United States last year, and experts say rapid growth in transportation electrification is likely to continue. Federal funds will help to develop a national charging network and incentivize consumers to purchase dozens of new models that automakers are bringing to market.

#### **ASPA-STPA's Best Student Paper Award Committee**

Wednesday, February 1st (in-person), hosted by American Society for Public Administration (ASPA)

STPA invites undergraduate and graduate students who have written research papers related to transportation policy and administration to submit them for consideration. Papers should be prepared according to a standard style such as APA. They should be between 20 and 35 pages in length and include citations and references. The review committee encourages students to submit copies of conference papers or unpublished manuscripts. Literature reviews and review essays are not eligible for consideration. Papers co-authored with faculty members are not eligible. The maximum number of student collaborators is limited to three. The committee will evaluate papers in a blind review process. Students are asked to submit a separate title of the paper and only include the author(s) name and affiliation on the title page.

Webinar: Arterial Signal Timing Implementation, Evaluation, and Related Performance Measures

This webinar is one in a series related to the design and operation of signalized intersections. There is much material available on the development of signal timing patterns, including data collection, modeling, and optimization, but not much information exists on how to implement those timing parameters into the intersection controllers and the fine-tuning needed to provide the optimum corridor operation. This webinar will close that gap by discussing the best practices for implementing new timings, evaluating those timings through a fine tuning process and developing a before-and-after analysis, and a discussion of arterial performance measures that can be monitored to identify any degradation of the timing patterns.
