CARB's Scoping Plan for Climate Action Calls for Much Less Driving

Yesterday the California Air Resources Board adopted its 2022 "Scoping Plan," which outlines the policies and strategies that multiple state agencies will be expected to deploy in the coming years to fight climate change. One is that, as adopted, the scoping plan doubled the goals for reductions in driving (VMT, or vehicle miles traveled) over what it originally called for in the draft plan released in May.

"Freight was plentiful, we were still seeing the remnants of the equipment shortage in the first couple of quarters," said Scott Dismuke, vice president of operations at the Professional Driver Agency.

DOT to Provide \$1.5 Billion for Hard-to-Fund Transportation Projects

The department will provide the funding through the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity discretionary grant program, known as RAISE, allowing local and state governments to get financial support for transportation projects that other DOT programs usually do not fund. The department will consider several factors, including environmental sustainability and economic competitiveness, when making funding decisions.

Metra Board of Directors approves \$33.9 million contract to make three Metra Electric stations accessible

The Metra Board of Directors approved a \$33.9 million contract to completely rebuild and make accessible three stations on the Metra Electric Line on the South Side of Chicago – the 79th, 87th and 103rd Street stations. The work is part of the Metra Electric Community Initiative, a multiyear, multimillion-dollar plan to transform 13 stations on the line.
