Restored Rail Line Reconnects Southern Nevada Cities

For the first time in 20 years, passengers boarded a train Friday connecting Boulder City to Henderson. An art deco-style steel truss bridge spanning nearly 364 feet helped restore service on the Boulder Branch rail line, a spur that curves away from the main Union Pacific line in Las Vegas, runs through Henderson and — once again — connects to Boulder City. "We're talking about a day where we're making history, but we're also restoring history,"said Gov. Brian Sandoval. The RASC will be awarding three \$2,500 scholarships to undergraduate students and three \$2,500 scholarships to graduate students for a total of six scholarships. The minimum criteria for the scholarships are:

AAUW Educational Funding And Awards For Graduate and Doctoral Students Applications open by August 1, 2018

The American Association of University Women offers various educational funding and grants to women pursuing Graduate and Doctoral Programs aiming to improve their quality of life and social barriers. AAUW calls for applications from women pursuing education in Graduate and Doctoral Programs to win grants and achieve more in their careers.

Few of the grants are below.

American Fellowships: Applications are open August 1 through November 15, 2018. Funding amounts are \$6,000 to \$30,000. Women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research full time, or preparing research for publication for eight consecutive weeks.

<u>International Fellowships</u>: Applications are open August 1 through December 1, 2018. Funding amounts are \$18,000 to \$30,000. Women pursuing full-time graduate or postdoctoral study in the United States who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
