Self-Driving Cars Are Coming. Will They Serve Profit or the Public?

Under ordinary circumstances, the death of a homeless woman trying to cross a road in Arizona would barely arouse notice. But the March 18 death of Elaine Herzberg, 49, in Tempe, was an international news event as she was struck by a Volvo SUV steered by Uber's self-driving car technology. She was the first pedestrian killed by a selfdriving car. Until recently, self-driving cars were an abstraction, a dreamy, far-off idea. Now they are literally crashing into us. Twenty-four U.S. cities are either running autonomous vehicle (AV) test programs or have committed to doing so, according to the Bloomberg Aspen Initiative on Cities and Autonomous Vehicles.

How Ride-hailing Could Improve Public Transportation Instead of Undercutting it

Over the last half-decade, public transit ridership declined nationwide. The number of vehicle miles traveled in cars is rising, and traffic congestion is getting worse in many U.S. cities. At the same time, the century-old taxi industry is struggling, with many taxi companies going bankrupt. While ride-hailing threatens public transit, it is also key to its future success - but only with smart policies and the right price signals. People are choosing ride-hailing because transit does not match the comfort and convenience offered by private vehicles, and taxis cannot offer the affordability and transparency of appbased ride-hailing.

AAUW Educational Funding and Awards For Graduate and Doctoral Students Applications Open August 1, 2018

The American Association of University Women offers various educational funding and grants to women pursuing Graduate and Doctoral Programs aiming to improve their quality of life and social barriers. AAUW calls for applications from women pursuing education in Graduate and Doctoral Programs to win grants and achieve more in their careers.

Several of the grants are below.

American Fellowships: Applications are open August 1 through November 15, 2018. Funding amounts are \$6,000 to \$30,000. Women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research full time, or preparing research for publication for eight consecutive weeks.

International Fellowships: Applications are open August 1 through December 1, 2018. Funding amounts are \$18,000 to \$30,000. Women pursuing full-time graduate or postdoctoral study in the United States who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
