Study Finds Self-driving Cars Repeatedly Fail to Stop for Obstacles

Self-driving cars have been found to not stop for certain obstacles or have

are a-changing: Lawmakers in Georgia's historically anti-transit Gwinnett County on Tuesday approved a ballot initiative for a one-cent sales tax hike to bring heavy rail and bus rapid transit to the fast-growing traffic-choked county northwest of Atlanta.

If approved in March, the "once unimaginable" tax hike would raise \$5 billion over 30 years and fund construction of heavy rail that would connect the most-populated areas of the county to the larger metro Atlanta transit system, MARTA.

presented other dangerous situations unless a driver takes immediate manual control, according to a new study from the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS). During a sequence of on-road and track tests for BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Tesla and Volvo, IIHS researchers discovered that self-driving cars repeatedly either failed to recognize obstacles or failed to stop when presented with one. Other times, the cars would crash in response to an obstacle if the driver didn't take over.
