

Study: Uber and Lyft are Increasing Traffic Deaths

A new study from the Booth School at the University of Chicago estimates Uber and Lyft have increased traffic deaths by 2-3 percent nationally. That's as many as 1,100 additional deaths a year — a small, but significant contribution to the increase in traffic deaths in the U.S. since 2011, the authors say.

Helsinki's MaaS App: Is It Really Mobility's Greatest Hope?

A mid-sized city on the edge of Europe, Helsinki punches far above its weight in the world of urban mobility. With a regional population of 1.4 million, Helsinki has become a global testing ground for the ideas behind Mobility as a Service (MaaS: allowing commuters to plan and pay for trips across multiple transportation modes through a single access point). Many see it as the next big thing in mobility.

In Boston, a town stocked with more than a dozen major universities and colleges and full of urbanists and transit enthusiasts—the kind of people who actually get together over beers just to geek out about transportation policy—Ebuña, 31, and Ofsevit, 34, have become spokespeople for the city's younger generation of transit riders: millennials who've rejected suburban life to go car-free or car-light in the city, who track the T's open-source data via smartphone to gain a speedier edge on their commutes.

Donald Shoup is a distinguished research professor in the Department of Urban Planning at UCLA. His recent research has focused on how parking policies affect cities, the economy, and the environment. In his book, The High Cost of Free Parking, Shoup argued that cities should charge fair market prices for on-street parking, use the meter revenue to finance added public services in the metered neighborhoods, and remove off-street parking requirements. In his new book, Shoup and his coauthors explain how these proposals have worked out in practice.

CTF invites interested students to apply to more than 35 scholarships, some of which have specific deadlines and application windows. To qualify for CTF scholarships, recipients must be intent on a career in transportation, attend a school in California, and be U.S. citizens, permanent residents or documented, international students.
