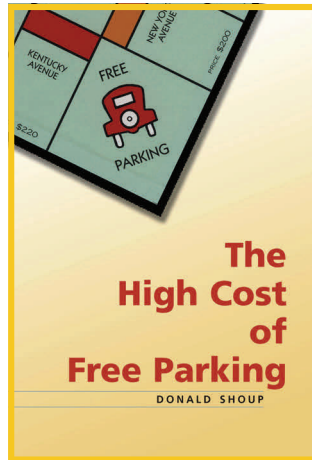

Dr. Donald Shoup

A Progress Report on Parking Reforms



ABSTRACT: Several cities have adopted Donald Shoup's recommendations to reduce off-street parking requirements, charge fair market prices for curb parking, and dedicate the meter revenue to finance added public services in the metered districts. He will discuss the reasons for these policies, and the results of adopting them.

SPEAKER BIO: Donald Shoup is a professor of urban planning at UCLA, where he has served as Chair of the Department of Urban Planning and as Director of the Institute of Transportation Studies. Much of his research has focused on parking as a key link between transportation and land use. This research has drawn widespread praise for revealing how parking policies can help or harm cities, society, the economy, and the environment.
