

What an Anti-Transit Federal Transit Administration Looks Like

What happens when a government administration stops administering? Right now, urban commuters are finding out. The Federal Transit Administration, the U.S. agency responsible for funding and guiding new fixed-route local transit projects, has officially become unaccountable to its basic duties, according to a new report by the Government Accountability Office. Its findings are the latest sign that the FTA is blocking federal support for rail and bus systems, with no apparent rationale but
