The New Metro Regional Connector Is Now Open. Here's What You Need To Know

The new Metro Regional Connector will make it easier to move between East L.A., Long Beach, and Azusa with less transfers. The new light rail will allow Angelenos to move more fluidly between East L.A., Long Beach and Azusa, saving them about 20 minutes of their commute. The connector combines the A (Blue), E (Expo), and L (Gold) lines into two rail lines at the core of Downtown Los Angeles.

The number of truck drivers looking to jump to a different carrier has been decreasing since last year, but that hasn't stopped recruiters from pursuing them, according to a recent survey. The Spring 2023 Driver Survey found that just 33.8% of truck drivers were actively looking for a new job, versus 66.2% who were not. That compared with 37.4% who were actively looking during the same time last year and 40.2% in a fall survey.

CA: Is BART Policing Racially Motivated? A New Study Intends to Find Out

A new study will analyze how the BART police force responds to incidents of fare evasion - and whether race plays a role in the transit authority's law enforcement. Past research shows Black BART riders were stopped by the subway's police eight times more often than their White counterparts from 2012 to 2017, while also being 15 times more likely to experience a use of force from the BART Police Department.

Webinar: Safety by the Numbers: Measuring the Pedestrian and Bicyclist Experience at Intersections from Alternatives Analysis Through Final Design

Thursday, June 22nd at 11:00 am PDT, hosted by ITE Traffic Engineering Council

The 20 Flags Method, found in NCHRP Report 948, is a quantitative analysis for pedestrian and bicyclist safety at intersections. While operational and safety evaluations of control types existed for vehicles through the Intersection Control Evaluation process (ICE), no such quantitative method had been widely promoted for pedestrians and bicycles. The 20 Flags Method moves toward modal equity by creating a quantitative analysis which can be evaluated alongside vehicular analyses. Further, once the intersection control type has been selected, the method can be used by the design team to evaluate and identify safety concerns at each stage of design, providing feedback on issues which need to be addressed.

Working in Warehousing & Logistics

Tuesday, July 11st at 5:30 am PDT(online), hosted by National Careers Service West Midlands

The handling, storage and movement of goods and materials is a vast and complex business. To keep pace with the needs of manufacturers and retailers, warehouse work is available at all levels, from jobs that require no qualifications for entry, to positions for university graduates. On our roads, thousands of vans and lorries take all sorts of products and raw materials to where they are needed - to factories, warehouses, and shops, or to shipping ports or airports for export. Just think of the products in supermarkets - they all need to be supplied regularly - sometimes daily from all over the world. Management of the movement of goods and materials along the supply chain, from the source of raw materials to a finished product delivered to the end-user, is called logistics, and is a complex business. Advances in computer technology and automation have made a difference to the way warehouses operate. Within a few hours of receiving an order, items can be gathered and delivered. The increase in online shopping means that single items need to be selected or 'picked' from the shelves and sent to individual customers, rather than dealing with bulk orders.

Webinar: Understanding Logistics

Thursday, Sep 21st at 4:00 am PDT, hosted by Empowering SMEs in International Trade programme

For UK companies exclusively trading with the EU, 1st January 2021 came as a significant shock, and the following months placed a spotlight on logistics companies and the important role they play in global trade. As companies have subsequently grappled with how they can continue to trade seamlessly with the EU, they may have explored EU warehousing or 3PL solutions to achieve economies of scale in transport and documentation costs, or to overcome issues with EU VAT. The fact is that logistics is a small word that covers many elements, from storage, warehousing, and materials handling, through to transport, information and control. The UK logistics industry has doubled in size since 2012 and added a further 190K of workers between 2019 and 21 alone, making it one of the UK's faster growing sectors. So how does this sector support global traders i.e. importers and exporters? What happens to our goods along the way, how are our goods handled? What involvement do traders have? How do these companies help ensure we maintain high levels of compliance both in our domestic market and overseas? What changes are we going to see in the coming years and how can traders best prepare?
