## **Transportation Speaker Series: Transportation's Linkage to the Affordable Housing Problem**



Housing costs are burdensome for over half of all renters in the US and a quarter of homeowners, especially in California and the Northeast (falling most heavily on lower income groups, alongside problems of overcrowding and substandard housing quality). Transportation has been a tool to open up new areas for housing development, but as full costs of mobility have been more fully recognized, strategies that emphasize accessibility have increasingly been promoted. The seminar will discuss both causes and potential cures for this public policy problem.
