

Parking and the City

By Donald Shoup



Donald Shoup is a distinguished research professor in the Department of Urban Planning at UCLA. His recent research has focused on how parking policies affect cities, the economy, and the environment. In *The High Cost of Free Parking*, Shoup argued that cities should charge fair market prices for on-street parking, use the meter revenue to finance added public services in the metered neighborhoods, and remove off-street parking requirements. In his new book, Shoup and his coauthors explain how these proposals have worked out in practice.

Donald Shoup

is a Fellow of the American Institute of Certified Planners, an Honorary Professor at the Beijing Transportation Research Center, and the Editor of *ACCESS*. In 2015, the American Planning Association gave Shoup *its highest honor, the National Excellence Award for a Planning Pioneer.*
