Gentrification Near Rail Transit Areas

Presented by Gene Burinskiy



"Gentrification Near Rail Transit Areas: A micro-data analysis of moves into and out of Los Angeles Metro rail station areas" leverages annual California tax filing data in Los Angeles County to track the in and out mobility of households residing near LA Metro stations between 1994 and 2012. We use these data to examine the income distribution of LA Metro stations and assess whether it has changed in response to the opening of LA Metro stations.
