Dr. Sara E. Brown is a Postdoctoral Teaching Fellow at USC Shoah Foundation - The Institute for Visual History and Education. Prior to her Ph.D. in comparative genocide studies, Brown researched globalization and conflict at the Interdisciplinary Center in Israel and served as a project coordinator in refugee camps in western Tanzania. Brown is also the author of *Gender and the Genocide in Rwanda: Women as Perpetrators and Rescuers*. Her work at USC Shoah Foundation focuses on the power of testimony, harnessing USC Shoah Foundation's Visual History Archive and free education portal, IWitness University, to support post-secondary education initiatives around the globe.
